NESSET FLY-FISHING LODGE

The location is the fertile and flat land on the bank of Glomma where it makes a bend approximately 1500 meters down from the famous Kvennan Camping. The river in this area is rather shallow and wide. This combined with the existence of a number of small islands in the river has created a very attractive environment for grayling, trout and of course fly-fishing enthusiasts. This stretch of the river is now a fly-fishing only zone, with a bag limit and limitations on the number of licenses issued.

We are currently restoring several old buildings on and around the farm that will be used for accommodation and other facilities for fishing tourists. In this brochure you can see what we have to offer for the fly fishing season of 2007.



THE BLACKSMITHS PLACE



Our most exclusive unit is the an old timber building once used as a blacksmith-workshop. Idyllically located directly on the riverbank about 100 meters from the farm - it contains; two bedrooms, bathroom, kitchen with all modern facilities, and a living room with the big old restored fire-place as the centerpiece. There is also a spacious upstairs loft for sleeping. The whole building has waterborne floor heating. And for further relaxation the sauna house is just next door.



Up to 5 people will be able to live very comfortably in this uniquely rustic but luxurious setting.

THE PARMHOUSE

The main farmhouse is a large traditional 1 ½ story timber building from the early 19th century. The house was recently fully restored and the interior was redecorated in 2005. It is fully equipped with kitchen, two spacious living rooms, 3 bedrooms, washroom, bathroom and an extra toilet.



The main living room contains a nice open fireplace and a unique 18th century clockwork. The big verandah is placed on the riverside of the house overlooking the strawberry garden. The house can easily accommodate up to 10 people.

THE STABBUR





The "Stabbur" is a characteristic small two story building that was used for food storage in the old days. Now it contains an upstairs bedroom with two beds with a very nice view of the river, and a common room with simple kitchen facilities downstairs. Guests living here will have access to bathroom and toilet facilities in the barn building

THE SAUNA

Next to the Blacksmiths place we have restored a small timber cabin that has been made into a fully equipped sauna with shower, toilet and change room. This is off course available for all guests living in the blacksmith house, but on agreement it can also be used by other guests on the farm.



OTHER ACTIVITIES

From the middle of July every summer, hundreds of farmers move their milking cows up to their summer farm in the mountains. Several of these summerfarms (Seter) are open for visitors.
- The World Heritige site, Røros is only a short drive away. Sometimes called a "living museum" - the old mining town is famous for its well preserved architecture.
